PACE Acceptance by boards is defined as recognizing the criteria of PACE as sufficient to meet board standards so that PACE Recognized providers may receive CE course credit approval without individual course application and fee submission. Note that specific subjects may be prohibited by board statute, rule, or regulation.

Through economies of scale, PACE reduces onerous paperwork and review processes, completing a single assessment on behalf of all boards where once each completed its own.

Furthermore, by focusing on recognizing providers, PACE offers a single, cohesive evaluation instead of repetitive reviews that bog staff down and reduce accessibility for practitioners to find CE. Random and targeted courses reviews ensure PACE compliance

Finally, PACE automatically generates comprehensive, on-demand earned credit reports for boards to verify CE credits, dramatically reducing the staff time and cost involved in auditing relicensure compliance.

Who has authority to approve continuing education for license renewal?

State and provincial regulatory boards have the authority and are charged with the task of determining appropriate programs for licensure renewal in their individual jurisdiction. These boards can use PACE to assist them with the approval process for programs that have already been through the PACE's rigorous evaluation.

What are the PACE requirements?

PACE is governed by two primary authoritative documents - the Policies & Procedures and the Criteria for Quality Continuing Education. These documents outline the PACE program as well as the specifics of compliance. To obtain a copy of these documents, visit www.fclb.org or call 970-356-3500.

Is it mandatory for a CE provider to be recognized by PACE?

No. Participation in PACE is voluntary. Regulatory boards still maintain ultimate authority over CE credit acceptance and so may continue to accept independent applications for approval. In addition, providers may seek the benefits of PACE without actually applying directly by partnering with an already Recognized Provider.

Who qualifies as a Recognized Provider?

Any provider of quality continuing education may apply. Applicant providers must have taught continuing education programs long enough to be able to document both the willingness and necessary infrastructure to offer quality CE courses.

Recognition is extended to those who comply with the PACE governing documents. When approving providers, the FCLB Board considers the recommendations of the PACE Committee as based on the investigative efforts of the Review Team.

If a regulatory board accepts PACE, does it have to accept all of its offerings?

No. PACE does not override board authority. Therefore, any subjects prohibited by statute, regulation, or rule may be excluded for CE credit in that jurisdiction. PACE's earned credit reports clearly identify these excluded subject areas.
